

Harvest Time

Each player takes a farm map. On your turn roll the dice twice and use the numbers to find the co-ordinates on the game board below (the first number is the across number, the next is the up number.) Place the crop/animal into one of your fields (you may either draw or write it). If you roll a 'new fence' space you can split ANY unfilled field into two by drawing a fence across it (this gives you an extra field.)

The yield of each crop/animal is shown on the grid below but check the bonuses underneath to see ways to increase your yield. Think carefully where to put each crop/animal to earn the most money.

The game ends when a player rolls a double 6 or when all players have filled all their fields. At the end of the game players add up their total yield, whoever earned the most money is the winner.



* Double the yield on both fields if two crops/animals the same are next to each other

* Double the yield on livestock () is a feed () is grown next door.

* Double the yield on beeds if flowers () are grown next door.

* Double the yield on fertilised crops () if bees are kept next door.

!Next door means the two fields MUST be touching (separated only by a fence, NOT diagonal!)
